Lake Michigan College's men's team hosted Hope College's JV team and beat the Flying Dutchmen 80-65.

Ken Coates led the Red Hawks with 19 points and seven rebounds.

Terrell Clinton also added 18 points for Lake Michigan (3-2).

The Red Hawks jumped out to an early lead and went into the locker room up by 10.

Clinton added nine of his 18 points in the second half to help his team coast to the win.

No. 21 Michigan State defeats Detroit 80-41

EAST LANSING, Mich. (AP) — Brannndais Agee scored a game-high 17 points and grabbed 11 rebounds as No. 21 Michigan State defeated Detroit 80-41 on Tuesday night.

Klarissa Bell added 16 points and Tori Jankoska 12 for the Spartans (3-1), and marked the 14th-straight victory over Detroit (1-4). The Titans have not defeated Michigan State since 1994 when current coach Autumn Rademacher scored 20 as a Titan sophomore.

Elisha Crosby was top scorer for Detroit with 13 points and Senee Shearer added nine.

The Titans never led but had tied twice in the early going until Agee and Bell each hit 3-pointers as the Spartans broke away to lead by 20 at halftime. Agee also had three of Michigan State's eight blocked shots, and scored well above her season average of six points

per game. The Spartans out-rebounded Detroit 49-31.

Taco Bell keeps MSU basketball giveaway

EAST LANSING, Mich. (AP) — Free tacos are back on the menu for Michigan State basketball fans this season.

For years, Taco Bell locations in and around East Lansing gave out a free taco to fans with a ticket stub from a game where the Spartans scored at least 70 points. That led fans to chant "We want tacos" at the team's home court as the team approached the 70-point threshold.

Taco Bell ended the promotion this season, but fans who apparently didn't hear of the change have been lining up at Taco Bell locations after games.

On Wednesday, the fast food chain announced that its local operators and will continue the giveaway at 10 locations for the rest of the season.

Red Wings' DeKeyser out at least 3, 4 weeks

DETROIT (AP) — The Detroit Red Wings have taken a big hit on their blue line.

Detroit defenseman Danny DeKeyser is expected to be out for at least three to four weeks with a separated left shoulder. The team doesn't expect him to need surgery.

DeKeyser was hurt early in Tuesday night's 2-0 loss to the Nashville Predators when he checked into the boards by Predators forward Patric Hornqvist. DeKeyser ranks among rookie leaders with seven assists and has scored two goals.

The Red Wings will host Carolina on Thursday night, hoping to snap a pair of skids.
