LMC men lose close game to Joliet

JOLIET, Ill. — Lake Michigan College's men's basketball team dropped its first game of the season 60-58 to Joliet Junior College on Thursday.

The Red Hawks (2-1) trailed by six with three minutes to play, and tied the game at 58 on a Loren Johnson layup with 10 seconds left in the game.

But Joliet's Deiondre Cunningham hit a shot with two seconds remaining to give the Wolves the win.

Roy Napier led the Red Hawks with 18 points and four assists, while also adding six rebounds.

Johnson led the team with seven rebounds.

LMC will play at Owens Community College at 3 p.m. today.

Stenson out front in World Tour

DUBAI, United Arab Emirates (AP) — Henrik Stenson remained in position to win the European Tour money title, opening a one-stroke lead Friday in the season-ending World Tour Championship.

The Swede had an 8-un-

der 64 to reach 12 under after two rounds on Jumeirah's Earth Course.

Stenson also leads the Race to Dubai standings. The points champion will receive \$1 million from a \$3.75 million bonus pool that counts on the final money list.

In September, Stenson won the PGA Tour's season-ending Tour Championship to take the FedEx Cup title and \$10 million bonus.

Nordqvist leads Lorena Ochoa Inv.

GUADALAJARA, Mexico (AP) — Sweden's Anna Nordqvist and South Korea's So Yeon Ryu each birdied the final hole for a share of the second-round lead with Thailand's Pornanong Phatlum in the Lorena Ochoa Invitational.

Nordqvist and Ryu shot 5-under 67 to match Phatlum at 9-under 135. Phatlum, the first-round leader in the 36-player event, had a 69.

South Korea's Inbee Park was a stroke back along with Americans Lexi Thompson and Gerina Piller.
