### Andrews tops LMC men in overtime

Andrews University beat the Lake Michigan College men's team 67-64 in overtime on Saturday night at home.

Andrews (5-4) outscored LMC 7-4 in the overtime period to win and sweep the season series.

Tyler Wooldridge scored 21 points and Junior Orelus scored 16 to guide to Cardinals to the win.

LMC (4-3) had four players in double figures with Ken Coats leading the way with 17, and Benton Harbor graduate Roy Napier chipping in 10.

The Red Hawks led 35-26 at the half, but the Cardinals outscored LMC 34-25 to send the game into overtime.

### MSU fans get rowdy after Big Ten title win

EAST LANSING, Mich. (AP) — Thousands of Michigan State students and fans have celebrated the football team's Big Ten title with large, rowdy bonfires and overturning at least one car.

East Lansing police say they arrested "multiple people" Saturday night near River and Cedar streets, a traditional spot for sports celebrations. The No. 10 Spartans defeated No. 2 Ohio State 34-24 late Saturday, earning its first Rose Bowl appearance in a quarter-century.

Police Capt. Jeff Murphy declined to release arrest figures Sunday, calling it "a large civil disturbance."

The Detroit News says celebrants threw landscaping trees, a bicycle and fire extinguishers into a bonfire near the Cedar Village apartments and overturned a car outside other apartment.

Officers surrounded another large fire about 2:30 a.m. Sunday and marched slowly down River Street to disperse the crowd.

### ND's Nix signs agent, to enter NFL draft

SOUTH BEND, Ind. (AP) — Notre Dame coach Brian Kelly says nose guard Louis Nix III has signed with an agent and will forego his final year of eligibility to enter the NFL draft, where he is projected

by many to be a first-round draft pick.

Nix's season came to an end Nov. 21 when he underwent season-ending surgery to repair a torn meniscus in his left knee. The 6-foot-2, 349-pound senior also had been slowed by tendinitis in the same knee.

Nix, who didn't play as a freshman, told media at the time he was undecided about whether he would return, saying his focus was on getting healthy.

Nix tweeted a message Friday of an emoticon crying and an Instagram photo taken from a car pulling away from Notre Dame with the Golden Dome reflected in the side driver's side mirror.

### Sans Crawford, 'Hawks top Panthers

CHICAGO (AP) — Patrick Sharp had a goal and two assists, and the Chicago Blackhawks scored a season-high three times on the power play in a 6-2 win over the Florida Panthers on Sunday night.

The Blackhawks used their potent offense to win after starting goalie Corey Crawford left in the first period because of a lower-body injury.

Marian Hossa, Brent Seabrook and Brandon Saad each had goal and an assist, and Michal Handzus and Andrew Shaw also scored. Patrick Kane had three assists for Chicago, which ended a three-game losing streak — its longest regular-season skid since February 2012.

Rookie Antti Raanta, recalled after veteran backup Nikolai Khabublin was injured on Nov. 16, stopped 29 of 31 shots for the win in relief of Crawford, who made four saves.

### Johnson rallies to beat Woods

THOUSAND OAKS, Calif. (AP) — Zach Johnson delivered the kind of theatrics that usually belong to Tiger Woods to win the World Challenge.

Johnson holed out for par from the drop area on the 18th hole at Sherwood that got him into a playoff, and he won when Woods hit a poor shot into the bunker and missed a 5-foot par putt on the first extra hole.
