person who may have been disgruntled.

"We had a police presence there yesterday for the termination, and that's not an uncommon request from work places if they think an employee will be less than happy," DeLand said Friday. "In today's society, it's better safe than sorry."

DeLand said school officials on Friday told police that a third party had informed them of a possible threat, without providing specific details. DeLand said an officer was sent to the campus in Benton Township and all campuses were closed for the day.

"At this point, it appears there's been no crime," De-Land said Friday afternoon. "No threats have been verified to warrant a criminal action. I think this was more about security protocol, and that's not a bad thing."

Kraklau said the college took precautionary steps to protect its campus locations and the college community.
