Western Michigan beats Central Michigan

KALMAZOO (AP) — David Brown scored 20 points and grabbed seven rebounds as Western Michigan handed Central Michigan its eighth-straight conference loss with a 75-72 victory Saturday.

Lawrence graduate Shayne Whittington added 14 points and eight rebounds for the Broncos (12-8, 5-3 MAC). Connor Tava scored 10 points and Tucker Haymond and Austin Richie each had eight.

Western Michigan dominated the first period with Whittington hitting from inside the paint and from the line to help put the Broncos up 23-9 midway. They led 42-25 at halftime.

Central Michigan came alive late in the second with a 26-13 surge to take the lead by one, 69-68, with 2:13 to play.
