Admirals defeat RiverHawks with ease

Led by 31 points from Nick Waddell the Lake Michigan Admirals defeated the Danvill RedHawks 131-95 on Saturday at Lake Michigan Catholic High School.

The Admirals, who led 68-39 at the half, had seven players who finished with double figure points in the rout. Graciano Negrón had 28 points for the Admirals, who shot 52 percent from the field.

LMC men take down Andrews University

Alec Brown scored a game-high 18 points and the Lake Michigan College men's team hit 13 3-pointers to top Andrews University 62-60 Saturday night.

Brown was 6-of-9 from 3-point range to lead the RedHawks (7-3) — who shot 52 percent from behind the arc.

Maier Colby and Andrews Simpson each scored 15 points for Andrews University in the loss.

Montel Green had eight rebounds for the RedHawks, and Darrell Ivy led all players with eight assists.

No. 19 MSU women routs Loyola of Chicago

CHICAGO (AP) — Aerial Powers had 14 points, 14 rebounds, five assists and a career-high three blocks to lead No. 19 Michigan State to a 90-38 rout over Loyola of Chicago on Sunday.

Michigan State used a 19-0 run to help build a 37-11 lead with 4:41 to play in the first half. An 11-4 run stretched the Spartans' lead to 48-15 at halftime.

Becca Mills scored 22 points to lead the Spartans. Tori Jankoska and Lexi Gussert added 15 points, and Jasmine Lumpkin had nine points with 11 rebounds. Powers picked up her seventh dou-

ble-double of the season.

It was the largest margin of victory for Michigan State (6-2), and the second by more than 40 points this season.

Taylor Johnson scored 14 points and had five steals to lead Loyola of Chicago (2-6).

It was the first meeting between the schools.

Arrest in shooting death of Auburn player

AUBURN, Ala. (AP) — Police say they've arrested a 22-year-old man in the fatal shooting of Auburn football player Jakell Lenard Mitchell.

Auburn Police Capt. Will Matthews issued an agency statement Sunday afternoon that said Markale Deandra Hart of Camp Hill, Alabama, has been arrested on a felony warrant charging him with murder. Police add Hart's being held at a county jail in the state.

It was not immediately known if Hart had an attorney and the statement didn't provide any details of how he was taken into custody. Police also disclosed in the statement that Mitchell, who was shot early Sunday at an off-campus apartment complex, received multiple gunshot wounds to the chest.

The statement says no additional arrests are expected at this time, but didn't elaborate further on the shooting and arrest.

'Hawks send Morin to Columbus for Erixon

CHICAGO (AP) — The Chicago Blackhawks have traded forward Jeremy Morin to the Columbus Blue Jackets for defenseman Tim Erixon.

Morin has no points in 15 NHL games this season. The winger was assigned to Rockford of the AHL for a conditioning assignment Tuesday because he wasn't playing at all with the loaded Blackhawks.

The 23-year-old Morin has eight goals and eight assists in 54 career regular-season games, all with Chicago. He also played in two postseason games in May.

Erixon, 23, had one goal and five assists in 19 games with Columbus this season. He scored his first NHL goal on Oct. 26 at Los Angeles.
