Bears place 10th at Cereal Bowl Relays

BATTLE CREEK — The St. Joseph boys swim team finished 10th with 180 points in the Cereal Bowl Relays at Battle Creek Central on Saturday.

The 400 freestyle relay team of Blaine Warmbein, Hunter Bard, Andrew Wells and Daniel Abby were the Bears' top finishers on the day, taking third with a time of 3:35.09. The 800 freestyle relay team of Liam Walls, Patrick Sawyer, Daniel Abby and Blaine Warmbein finished fifth in 8:26.71.

Ann Arbor Pioneer won the event with 376 points.

KALAMAZOO — Montel Green had 25 points and 10 rebounds to lead the Lake Michigan College men's basketball team past Schoolcraft College, 78-69, at the Kalamazoo Valley Cougar Classic on Saturday.

the field and also added four assists, two steals and a block for the RedHawks (7-2).

Kevion Morse (18), Alec Brown (13) and Labradford Sebree (15) also scored in double figures.

Morse led the team with 17 rebounds.

WMU out-rebounded in loss to Northeastern

BOSTON (AP) — Scott Eatherton scored 22 points on 9-of-15 shooting, grabbed 11 rebounds, and led Northeastern to an 81-69 win over Western Michigan on Saturday.

David Walker finished with 19 points for Northeastern (6-2), and Quincy Ford added 13 points, four assists, and three steals.

The Huskies were outshot by the Broncos, 46 percent to 44, but beat Western Michigan by 14 on the boards and hit 13 more free throws.

Austin Richie scored 18 to lead the Broncos (5-3). Connor Tava added 16 for Western Michigan.

ND women routed at home by UConn

SOUTH BEND (AP) — Morgan Tuck scored a career-high 25 points and Kiah Stokes added 18 rebounds to help No. 3 UConn beat second-ranked Notre Dame 76-58 on Saturday in the Jimmy V Classic.

When the two teams met last April in the national championship game, the Huskies came away with a 79-58 victory.

UConn (6-1) trailed 28-18 midway through the first half before Tuck and Stokes took over, keying a 22-4 run over the next 10 minutes.

Jewell Loyd scored 31 points to lead Notre Dame (8-1).
