I immediately wanted to be able to play The Beatles."

As a professional musician, Irizarry had his own Beatles tribute band in 2000, and played in the Chicago band The Cavern Beat for five years before hearing from a friend in the Beatle business that "Rain" Lennon. He joined "Rain" in 2010.
