LMC men crush Glen Oaks 104-64

BENTON TOWNSHIP — Alec Brown scored 30 points and the Lake Michigan College men's basketball team cruised by Glen Oaks Community College 104-64 Wednesday night.

Brown, who was 7-for-11 from the 3-point line, started the game hitting five straight 3s in the first half.
