LMC women to play Chesapeake in opening round

The Lake Michigan College women's basketball team feels more prepared this time.

Back in the National Junior College Athletic Association Division 2 national championship tournament for a fifth time in the last six years, the RedHawks have more experience than they did last season when they finished in seventh place.

"Last year we were pretty freshmen-laden," coach Jason Cooper said. "I think we are a little more prepared with how this group of sophomores handles pressure and the experience they have."

The emergence of Shalay Stevens as a viable scoring threat over the course of the season has given the RedHawks (24-8) another option along with shooters Sabrina Trujillo and Nicole Decker.

Stevens, a sophomore, was named the NJCAA District G MVP for her play during LMC's run to the national tournament.

Freshmen Christy Gonzalez and Lexi Cano have stepped up to add depth to the roster.

LMC has four sophomores on the roster, all of who saw meaningful minutes during last season.
