### VB death determined not suspicious

DECATUR — A Decatur Township man found dead in his home Tuesday died of a heart attack, an autopsy determined.

Lt. Dale Hinz of the Paw Paw state police post provided the update on what was originally deemed “a suspicious death” Wednesday afternoon.

Terry Dean Gillam, 65, made a 911 call at 5:20 a.m. Tuesday, and state police found him dead in his home when they arrived, Hinz said earlier.

In his update, Hinz said the reason police were suspicious about the death was that Gillam made reference to a “disturbance at his home” when he called 911.

### BH man charged with perjury in GR case

GRAND RAPIDS — A Benton Harbor man has been charged with perjury in connection with a homicide that occurred outside a Grand Rapids restaurant, MLive reported.

Shaquille Lamar Bunting, 21, was arraigned in Kent County on Monday on three counts of perjury for allegedly lying about his participation in a fight that preceded the shooting death of 32-year-old Terence Hollis, MLive reported.

Police said Hollis, of Grand Rapids, was involved in an altercation that started inside the Chicken Coop early March 22. The fight escalated and continued into the parking lot, where Hollis was shot.

Bunting is accused of lying when he told investiga-

tors he did not know the names of people at the Chicken Coop and that he did not participate in the fight or throw punches inside the restaurant. He is further accused of lying about his actions in the parking lot, including his testimony that was not present when the gunshot was fired, records show.

Bunting is held without bond. He is expected to appear in court April 15 for a preliminary hearing. The homicide remains under investigation.

### Electronic recycling event April 15 in SH

SOUTH HAVEN — Unwanted electronics can be dropped off for recycling 3-7 p.m. Wednesday, April 15, at LMC’s South Haven campus, 125 Veterans Blvd.

Accepted items include computers, laptops, smart phones, monitors, TVs, telephones, cameras, DVD players, cords/cables, printers, toner cartridges, cell phones, refrigerators, air conditioners, and any other electronic items or items with a cord.

All items are recycled free of charge except for a \$5 hazardous waste fee for CRT monitors and \$10 fee for tube TVs. All computer hard drives are wiped to Department of Defense specifications or shredded.

Rebate incentives will be offered to customers of Indiana Michigan Power, South Haven Public Works and Dowagiac Electric who recycle a working refrigerator, freezer, dehumidifier or room air conditioner.
