Carla Trynchuk and Olga Kaler present a violin recital featuring pieces by Jean-Marie Leclair, Sergei Prokofiev and Pablo de Sarasate at 8:15 p.m. Saturday at Andrews University's Howard Performing Arts Center, 4160 E. Campus Circle Drive, Berrien Springs.
