## Retired businessman adds LMC into his trust

BENTON TOWNSHIP — A retired businessman and Lake Michigan College alumnus is giving back in a big way to the institution that affected his life.

Edward Todd, who attended LMC from 1954 to 1956, is adding the college to a charitable trust he'd created for several other entities that made a mark in his life.

"I don't think, right now, especially in the state of Michigan, there's anything more important than education," Todd said. "So I do what I can, mostly for the high school."

In LMC's case, the trust contributions will be targeted for the Edward J. Todd Business Education and Resource Center, said LMC President Bob Harrison.

"Mr. Todd has put us in his estate plan, so he's a very nice man. I'm not sure what the valuation will be, but it's something for the future," Harrison said.

Harrison's comments followed last month's meeting, where the board recognized him for his contribution.

The center is part of a major overhaul envisioned for the Napier Avenue campus –
