Jones resigns as Niles football coach

Antwon Jones has resigned as Niles' head football coach and will take over as coach at South Bend Adams next season.

Jones coached Niles for four seasons, compiling a record of 13-23. Niles finished 5-4 in 2014, its first winning season since 2003. The Vikings were 2-7 this season.

"Coach Jones is a good man, and I wish him the best in his future endeavors," Niles athletic director Jeff Upton said in a press release. "Coach brought a wide-open spread offense to Niles and had confidence that every play called would work."

LMC men's hoops beats Andrews 68-58

The Lake Michigan College men's basketball team beat Andrews University 68-58 on Monday. Darrell Ivy led the Red Hawks with 16 points. Terry Davis added 15 points and seven rebounds. Mitch Meyer scored 14.

"We played a solid first half, which turned out to be the difference in the game," LMC coach Doug Schaffer said.

LMC led by nine at halftime, but let Andrews cut the lead to three with about three minutes left.

The Red Hawks held Andrews scoreless for more than two minutes and extended their lead back to 10.

Robert Moon led Andrews with 22 points. Nick Little scored 15 and Kris Owens added 10 points and 10 rebounds.

Irish women's hoops runs away from Valpo

VALPARAISO, Ind. (AP) — Marina Mabrey had the fifth triple-double in Notre Dame history to help twhe Irish to a 110-54 rout of Valparaiso on Monday night.

The freshman guard finished with 18 points and 10 assists — both career bests — and a school-record 12 steals for the No. 3-ranked Irish (4-0).

The last Notre Dame player with a triple-double was Skylar Diggins on Feb. 24, 2013.

Notre Dame turned Valparaiso turnovers into 51 points in the rout.

Thanks largely to eight steals and 14 points by Mabrey in the first half, the Irish (4-0) led the Crusaders 53-18 at the break. Notre Dame converted takeaways into 27 points in the first half alone.

WMU basketball beats Rochester (Mich)

KALAMAZOO, Mich. (AP) — Kellen McCormick scored a career-high 31 points on 11-for-14 shooting to lead Western Michigan past Rochester College (Mich.) 85-73 Monday night.

McCormick, a junior, entered the season averaging just 3.7 points per game and scored 12 points in Western Michigan's first two contests of the year. He finished 9 for 11 from 3-point range. Trailing 45-41 early in the second half, the Broncos went on a 40-24 spurt to seize control and build an 81-69 lead on Tucker Haymond's layup with 3:09 to play.
