LMC men's hoops loses at St. Clair County CC

The Lake Michigan College men's basketball team fell to St. Clair County 88-76 on the road Saturday. Michael Bush led the Red Hawks with 22 points and six assists in the losing effort.

Lake Michigan College (8-4) trailed by only a point at halftime. But St. Clair County opened the second half with an 18-5 run. The Red Hawks never recovered after that stretch.

In addition to Bush's 22 points, Arsenio Arrington scored 18 points and grabbed 10 rebounds. St. Clair County had five players reach double figures in points. Rico Cook led the way with 17 points.

Coach Doug Schaffer called the loss "another tough road loss against a quality opponent."

No. 3 Notre Dame women win at TCU

FORT WORTH, Texas (AP) — Kathryn Westbeld had 12 points and 14 rebounds as No. 3 Notre Dame beat TCU 88-72 on Saturday, when the Fighting Irish played a game in the Dallas-Fort Worth area for only the second time.

The Irish (9-1) trailed only after the game's first free throw, and went ahead to stay with an early 12-0 run. Westbeld's second double-double led five Notre Dame players in double-figure scoring. Arike Ogunbowale had 21 points, Madison Cable 16, Michaela Mabrey 15 and Lindsay Allen 10.

Zahna Medley had 22 points and Veja Hamilton 14 for TCU (7-3), which had its 12-game home winning streak snapped in its final game at the cramped University Recreation Center.

Louisville cruises past Eastern Michigan

LOUISVILLE, Ky. (AP) — Damion Lee scored 16, all in the second half, and No. 22 Louisville shot 53 percent from the field to overwhelm Eastern Michigan 86-53 on Saturday.

Louisville (7-1) torched another opponent in shooting better than 50 percent for the seventh time in eight games this season. The Cardinals entered the game leading the country in scoring margin at more than 30 points a game.

Quentin Snider scored 13 points, Chinanu Onuaku had 12 and Ray Spalding and Trey Lewis added 11 each for Louisville. The Cardinals had 20 assists on 31 field goals.

Navy tops Army for 14th straight time

PHILADELPHIA (AP) — With a shot at history at stake, Keenan Reynolds ended his Navy career with a clean sweep against Army. Navy coach Ken Niumatalolo just might go out the same way.

Reynolds rushed for two touchdowns and threw for another score to lead the No. 21 Midshipmen to their 14th straight win over the Black Knights, 21-17 on Saturday at Lincoln Financial Field.
