LMC women shut Muskegon down in OT

BENTON TOWNSHIP — The Lake Michigan College women's basketball team outscored Muskegon Community College 10-0 in overtime to beat the Jayhawks 74-64 on Friday evening.

Muskegon (12-4 MC-CAA West, 18-6) held a 54-42 lead entering the fourth quarter, but LMC (13-3 MCCA West, 21-6) used a strong final quarter to force overtime.

The Red Hawks' defense allowed zero overtime points to seal the victory.

The Red Hawks controlled the glass, out-rebounding Muskegon 51-37 while shooting 17 of 38 from the free throw line.

Jade Mosier scored a game-high 26 points off the bench for LMC and Kelsee Kinder added 17.

Samantha Taylor led the scoring for Muskegon with 13 points.

Wade, Butler lead Bulls over Suns

CHICAGO (AP) — Dwyane Wade scored 23 points, Jimmy Butler added 22 and the Chicago Bulls rallied to beat the Phoenix Suns 128-121 in overtime Friday night.

Devin Booker scored 27 points for Phoenix, but missed a chance to win it in regulation after Wade fouled him on a 3-pointer with 1.5 seconds left. Booker hit the first two free throws to tie it, then

missed the third.

Wade and Butler led the Bulls as they rallied from 11 down in the fourth quarter to beat the Western Conference's last-place team.

Both players scored 14 points after the third quarter to help the Bulls win their third straight.

Nikola Mirotic scored 20 points and hit four 3-pointers. Robin Lopez added 19 points. Denzel Valentine, who figures to get more playing time after Doug McDermott was traded to Oklahoma City along with Taj Gibson on Thursday, had 15 points.

The rookie hit 5 of 8 3-pointers.

Palmer, Bryan share lead at Honda Classic

PALM BEACH GARDENS, Fla. (AP) — Ryan Palmer shot a 5-under 65 on Friday and shared the lead with PGA Tour rookie Wesley Bryan going into the weekend at the Honda Classic.

Palmer made seven birdies on another day of ideal scoring and reached 9-under 131.

Bryan, who had his best PGA Tour performance last week at Riviera, shot a 67 and saved his round with a bogey on the 13th hole when he had to play one shot from the trees with his putter.

They were a shot ahead of Rickie Fowler (66), with Anirban Lahiri (68) another shot behind.
